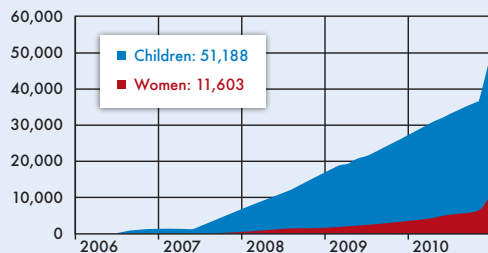

HHI's **impact on children** include: Orphanage directors reported that months after HHI's training, "no babies have died"; more bonded to their caregivers; happier, calmer and demonstrate earlier and greater language development; greater weight gain and health; easier to soothe.

HHI's **impact on women** include: greater awareness of child health, development and nutrition; more frequent, meaningful and gentle interactions with their children; greatly improved hygiene, sanitation and nutrition practices; a new sense of pride and community recognition for their critically important role as caregivers.

Hands to Hearts International was founded in 2004 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to improving the health and well-being of orphaned and vulnerable children through improved early childhood care.

2006

- HHI leads 1st trainings at orphanage in S. India
- Women trained show dramatically improved care for children
- Children benefit with greater health, weight gain and happiness
- Orphanage reports that months after HHI "No babies have died since"
- Trainings held for more than 20 orphanages, in both India and Russia

2007

- HHI is recognized by world's largest early childhood program - India's ICDS - and begins training ICDS teachers
- Expand operations to the state of Orissa, India
- Skoll Foundation report "Entrepreneurial Solutions to Insoluble Problems" highlights HHI's work
- HHI's Founder wins "Ordinary People, Extraordinary Outcomes" Award

2008

- Created a new, more comprehensive and culturally adaptable curriculum
- Release HHI's instructional Baby Massage DVD
- Present at the International Step By Step (ISSA) Conference in Budapest, Hungary
- Founder awarded "Making a Difference for Women Award" from Soroptomist International

2009

- HHI chosen as the "Innovation" in a USAID Child Survival grant with Medical Teams Int'l in post-conflict zone of Uganda
- Expand operations in India, training 50% more women, while spending 22% less
- HHI's Baby Massage DVD is being used as a tool by groups in: India, Sri Lanka, Russia, Moldova, Uzbekistan, Liberia, Uganda, Kenya, US, Canada and Australia

2010

- First year in Uganda, HHI trainings reach over 5,000-women and men!
- Growth into Uganda triples HHI reach
- HHI wins research award for innovative practices from the Asia Pacific Regional Network on Early Childhood
- HHI is invited to participate in UNESCO's first Early Childhood Conference
- Expanded training to include greater health information
